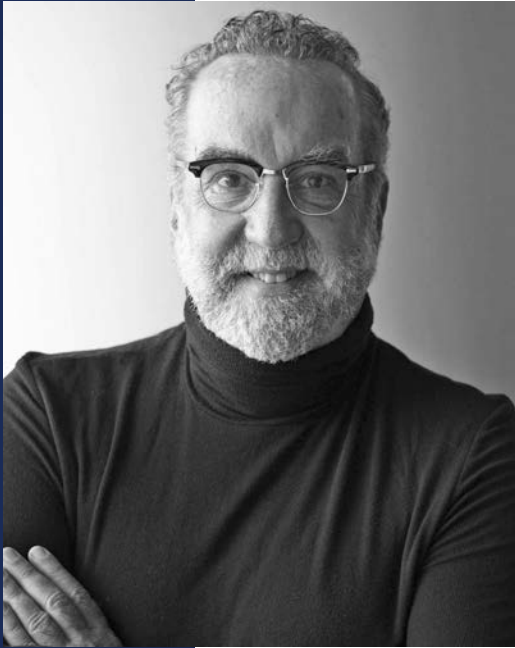

Stephen H. Frishberg

2019 Pillar of Achievement Recipient

“Stephen has the ability to balance life and work and turn ambition into accomplishments”

To put it simply, Stephen Frishberg is a man who makes things happen...a show of force who seldom takes no for an answer. From his position as partner in the Law Firm of Schachtel Gerstley Frishberg & Koplin to his many leadership roles, he's been a tireless leader, both professionally and charitably. Yet it's his current 12-year reign as Chairman of the Philadelphia Jewish Sports Hall of Fame that may well be his crowning achievement.

Twenty-one years since its founding, the Philadelphia Jewish Sports Hall of Fame was at a crossroads having been forced to vacate its home at the Gershman Y. But Frishberg, having a clear vision for its future, remained undeterred as he found an exciting new home in the Jewish Community Services Building to lead the organization into a new era.

In addition to his professional accomplishments Frishberg has served as Chairman of the Board of Golden Slipper Club & Charities, past President of the Golden Slipper Senior Center and past President and Vice President of the Cancer Support Community. He also has served on the boards of the Wellness Community, the Jewish Community Centers of Greater Philadelphia, the Locust Club and is a member of the Union League.

He and his family have been actively engaged since 1984 in raising funds for the American Cancer Society, having created the “Fab Five Racing Team” - which initially consisted of himself, his wife, Barbara, and their three children, Michael, Rachel & Laura. In addition to their running each year in a five mile race, they participated in the 1986 ACS 24 hour challenge, maintaining a walker on St. Joseph's track for 24 hours, successfully resulting in The Fab Five being the leading fundraiser for that event.

Thanks to his generosity and commitment, coupled with a dogged determination and his singular ability to “think outside the box”, he has the confidence to believe he can accomplish anything he sets out to do. The Philadelphia Jewish Sports Hall of Fame is proud to present Stephen H. Frishberg the Pillar of Achievement Award.

Chuck Brodsky is a storyteller, a songwriter, a troubadour and a modern day baseball bard. Over the past 25 years, he has performed at festivals and concerts all over the world including the Baseball Hall of Fame where 22 of his songs have been enshrined.

Born & raised in suburban Philadelphia, he attended The Haverford School and now lives in the mountains of North Carolina... but his blood still runs Phillies red. His song *Whitey & Harry* was featured in the documentary film *Richie Ashburn: A Baseball Life*, and the Sony Pictures feature film release *Radio* included an appearance by him as well as his original music as the closing title track song. Another of his compositions *Moe Berg: The Song* was featured in the PBS show: *Jews and Baseball: An American Love Story*.

Brodsky, who has garnered worldwide acclaim for his folk singing and song writing, began his career by dropping out of college to sing for tips on the streets of Europe. Then he performed in coffeehouses in the San Francisco Bay area.

Among his twelve CD's are two entire albums of baseball songs: *The Baseball Ballads* and *Baseball Ballads 2*. *The Ballad of Eddie Klepp*, about the first white man to play in the Negro Leagues has been heard on NPR's Morning Edition and was the inspiration for a feature story about Klepp that appeared in *The Washington Post*. *The Philadelphia Daily News* ran a story about Brodsky and his original composition about Richie Allen, *Letters in the Dirt*.

Another favorite topic Brodsky likes to explore is his Jewish heritage. His musically inclined great-great grandfather inspired *Old Song Handed Down* in which his grandson, Brodsky, asks him about life as a musician in a Russian peasant village in the late 1800's. The song *Lilly's Braids* was written after a visit to Yad Vashem in Jerusalem. Another of his compositions, *Gerta*, is a song about a doll donated by a Holocaust survivor who instructed it to "tell the world what we saw". Brodsky has recorded six songs about the Holocaust and plans to release an entire album of songs with Holocaust themes.

Brodsky's parents, Bunny and Frank, still reside in Lower Merion.

Colby Cohen

Ice Hockey

Colby Cohen was a noted professional hockey player as a defenseman in the National Hockey League with the Colorado Avalanche and the 2011 Stanley Cup Champion Boston Bruins. He currently serves as a color analyst for networks such as NBC Sports, Westwood One and ESPN.

Cohen was born and raised in Villanova and attended Radnor High School where he helped lead the Raiders to a Championship in the Inter-County Scholastic Hockey League. From there he moved onto the US National 17-18 team. Next, he attended Boston University and in his sophomore year enjoyed his most successful season when the Terriers won the 2009 National Championship. He not only earned selection to the Frozen Four All-Tournament Team but was named the Most Outstanding Player of the entire Tournament after scoring the game-winning goal in overtime to cement the Terriers National Championship.

Returning for his junior campaign, Cohen was named to both the Hockey East All-Star Team and the NCAA East All-American Team. During that season, he led the team's defense with 30 points in 36 games and scored 14 goals, the most scored in a single season by a BU Defenseman in over 30 years.

In 2010, Cohen ended his collegiate career by signing a contract with the NHL's Colorado Avalanche. After only three games with the Avalanche, Cohen was traded to the Boston Bruins where he received a Stanley Cup ring when the Bruins won the 2011 Stanley Cup.

Cohen joined NESN as a College Ice Hockey Analyst while also completing his degree in History from Boston University. After bouncing around European clubs for a season, he opted to end his professional playing career to pursue a career as a television analyst.

Cohen is a first cousin to Olympic skier and former Eagles player Jeremy Bloom and his sister, the author Molly Bloom.

Mike Koplove, a right-handed sidearm relief pitcher for two major league baseball teams, was born in Philadelphia during the bi-centennial year of 1976. He grew up playing little league and American Legion baseball in South Philly and attended Chestnut Hill Academy where he was named a first team All City selection by *The Philadelphia Daily News*.

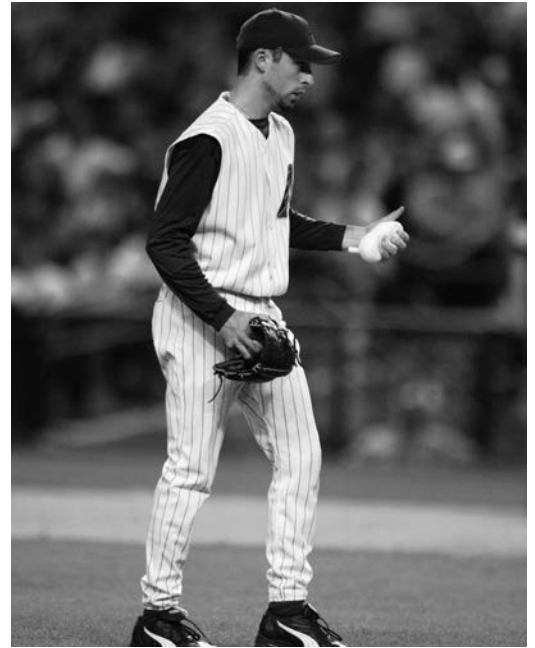
Koplove spent his first two years of college at Northwestern University playing shortstop and pitching before transferring to the University of Delaware where the team had a record of 43-8 and led his team to the 1998 America East Championship and the NCAA Atlantic II Regional. In addition, he was voted an Academic All American.

Drafted by Arizona, he made his major league debut in 2001 and pitched in the playoffs for the World Series Champions Diamondbacks. The next season, Koplove was 6-1 with a 3.36 ERA, giving up only 47 hits in 61.2 innings. He held batters to a .213 batting average and with men on base he was even stingier – .207/.228. In games that were late and close, he held batters to a .188 batting average. He finished his major league career with the 2007 American League Central Champion Cleveland Indians.

Another high point came as a member of the 2008 United States Olympic team in Beijing. Over the course of the Olympics, he pitched in five games and was the only American pitcher to not surrender a single hit or a run as the U.S. defeated Japan winning a Bronze Medal.

After his playing career ended, Koplove became a scout for the Los Angeles Angels. He left Anaheim after the 2017 season and currently works as a Special Assignment Scout for the Philadelphia Phillies.

He is the older brother of Kenny Koplove, a pitcher in the Colorado Rockies organization. Koplove lives in Haddonfield, NJ with his wife, Samantha and their children Vivienne and Alexander.

Chris O'Loughlin

Fencing



Chris O'Loughlin is accustomed to performing on center stage. Born in Los Angeles, his father was actor Gerald O'Loughlin who starred in the ABC television police drama series *The Rookies*. His mother, Meryl O'Loughlin, was VP of casting for Columbia Pictures Television. But any thought of show business for O'Loughlin was foiled by his love of swordplay, for he discovered *his* starring role in the competitive sport of fencing.

At the University of Pennsylvania, class of '89, he won the NCAA Championship in epee his freshman year and became a four time All-American and All-Ivy in Epee, one of the three disciplines in his sport. He won the Intercollegiate Fencing Association Eastern Championship in 1986 and received Penn's Riley Award as the outstanding freshman athlete. He also captained the Quaker fencing team. While at Penn, O'Loughlin was coached by another Philadelphia Jewish Sports Hall of Fame Inductee and long time Quaker coach, David Micahnik.

O'Loughlin won a silver medal at the 1989 Maccabiah Games and a bronze medal with the United States team at the 1991 Pan-American Games. He competed for the U.S. at the '92 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and was the first alternate in the '96 Atlanta Olympics. In 2000, O'Loughlin won the U.S. Individual National Championships in epee and won the National Championships in the Team event seven times with the New York Athletic Club (NYAC). He was inducted into the University of Pennsylvania Hall of Fame and served as the NYAC Fencing Chairman and as the United States Fencing Association Athlete's Representative.

This past October, O'Loughlin traveled to Livorno, Italy, where he helped Team USA capture a gold medal at the Veteran World Championships. Even better, he did it alongside two other former Penn fencers: Daryl Taylor and Walter Dragonetti. "I've won a lot of national tournaments and done well internationally, but I never had the good fortune to stand on the podium while they played the national anthem and raised the American flag. I honestly did not think it would affect me. But I was touched. I was really, really touched."

O'Loughlin mentors young national team fencers and lives in New Jersey with his young son, Finnian.

Few people in the competitive world of professional sports have had a year like the one Howie Roseman enjoyed in 2017. The Eagles Executive Vice President of Football Operations, now in his 19th season with the team, was named Executive of the Year by the Pro Football Writers of America for his role in constructing the franchise's Super Bowl LII winning roster. In addition, Roseman was voted The Sporting News NFL Executive of the Year by fellow league executives.

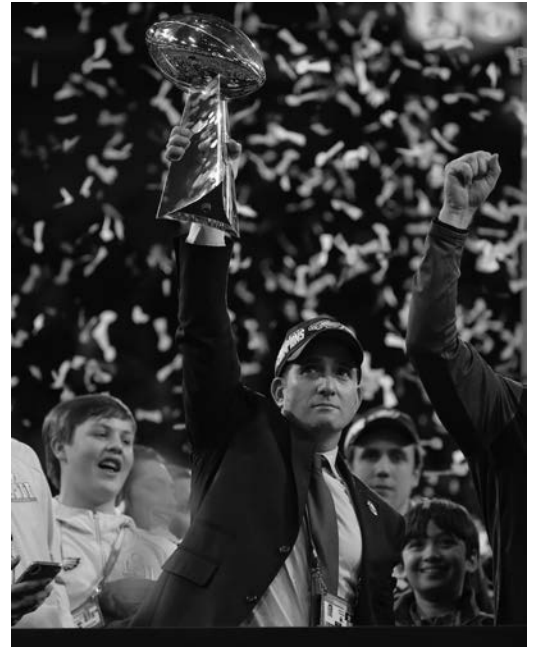
During the 2017 offseason, Roseman and the Eagles front office utilized free agency, executed trades and infused the roster with talent and youth during the NFL Draft, which was held in Philadelphia for the first time since 1961. Roseman's moves paid huge dividends when the Eagles captured the first Super Bowl title in franchise history with a 41-33 victory over the New England Patriots.

Prior to being promoted to his current role, Roseman served as the team's general manager from 2010-14. At the time of his 2010 promotion to general manager, he became the youngest NFL executive to be named to the post in three decades, at just 34 years old. Since hiring Roseman in 2000, the Eagles have earned 11 playoff berths, eight division titles, six NFC Championship appearances, two NFC Championship crowns and trips to Super Bowl XXXIX and Super Bowl LII.

Roseman is also active in the Philadelphia-area community, contributing to a variety of initiatives involving military and children. He was named Honorary Commander for the Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst for his continued efforts with the military. His charitable endeavors have benefited the Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation, the Boys & Girls Clubs of America, USA Football, Pop Warner and Cop Wheels. He is also a member of the Governing Body of the Global Sports Management Summit and YPO. In 2018, Roseman was the recipient of the Steinberg-DeNicola Humanitarian Award, an honor presented by the Maxwell Football Club to an NFL representative committed to doing good in their community.

Born in Brooklyn, NY, Roseman earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Florida before earning a JD degree from Fordham Law School.

Myra Sack

Soccer



Myra Sack is a diminutive dynamo in both the world of soccer and the game of life. As a high school student, she was named Main Line Athlete of the Year by the Main Line Times in 2006, and earned two-time All-State status in soccer; at Dartmouth College, she was a first-team All-Ivy Mid Fielder, Second Team All-Senior All-America, and won Dartmouth's Dean's Plate Award for her outstanding contribution to the campus, community and world. As a sophomore, Sack co-founded Athletes United, a youth sports program focused on making sport and mentorship accessible to all Upper Valley young people.

As a resident of Wynnewood, she attended Lower Merion High School where she was captain of both the soccer and basketball teams. Sack was MVP of the Central League in soccer and basketball during her high school career and was inducted into the Lower Merion High School Hall of Fame.

During her four years of collegiate soccer she was named Rookie of the Year, Dartmouth Soccer Player of the Year and was elected Team Captain. Sack received multiple awards for her success in the classroom as well as the soccer field, including NSCAA Scholar All-America and Academic All-Ivy status. As a junior she traveled to Nicaragua to volunteer for Soccer without Borders, an organization that seeks to improve the lives of marginalized youth through soccer and sport. She was Dartmouth's recipient of the Dickey Center Grant for her work in Nicaragua and the 2010 Dean of the College Award for Service.

She graduated cum laude in Government from Dartmouth and earned an MBA with high honors from Boston University. Currently, she is Chief Program Officer for SquashBusters, Inc., a program which challenges and nurtures urban youth as students, athletes and citizens so they can recognize and fulfill their greatest potential in life.

The daughter of Sandi Sherr and Mike Sack, she is a third generation Dartmouth Legacy. Sack lives in Jamaica Plain, MA with her husband, Matthew Goldstein and infant daughter, Havi.

Pine Forest Camp - Jewish Basketball League 1990-2006

2019 Simcha Gersh Award Recipient

The Philadelphia Jewish Sports Hall of Fame honors the Pine Forest Camp team of the Jewish Basketball League for its dominance in one of the premier adult men's leagues in our region. The league has enjoyed a long history of excellence which dates back to 1902 and was a precursor to the original SPHAS. The JBL was considered the league that attracted the very best Jewish players in the area during this era.

Norm Millan resurrected the league in 1989 after several years of dormancy. Pine Forest was awarded a franchise later that year. From the start, the team was successful with a deep playoff run in its first year. In 1990, the team added several key players to round out a talented roster. This skilled squad of players employed a balance of perimeter shooting, precise ball movement and tenacious defense to win three consecutive championships and begin to cement their legacy in the league. The league itself was very strong, consisting of mostly former high school or college players from the region who were Jewish.

Pine Forest Camp went on to win another 6 titles over an 8 year period. As the team aged, there were additions in the mid 2000s that contributed to the last two championships in 2005 and 2006. In total, the team won 11 championships over a 16 year period (1990-2006).

The JBL concluded play in 2006 and is hoping the next generation of basketball players in the region will resurrect the league, including, of course, the ultra successful Pine Forest Camp team about which the great Leaden Bernstein proclaimed: "This Pine Forest Team is the New York Yankees of the Jewish Basketball League and I predict that someday they will be in the Hall of Fame!"

The Olympic Tragedy

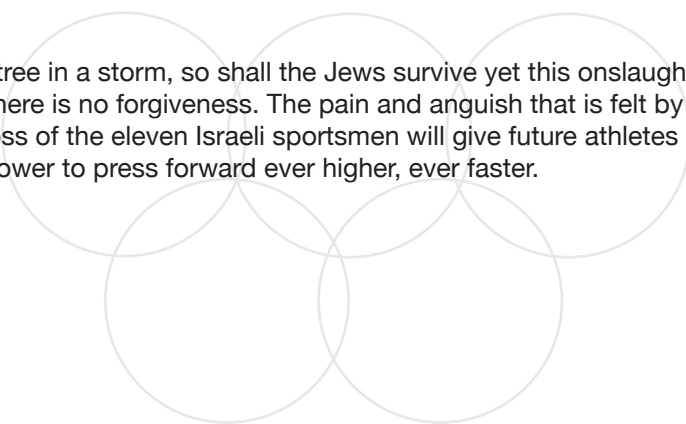
On the 5th of September, 1972, the ancient spectre of anti-semitism raised its ugly head to strike again at the Jewish people and the State of Israel. Eleven sportsmen, members of the Israeli team to the Munich Olympics, were murdered in cold blood, because they were Israelis, because they were Jews.

Israel's finest sportsmen had set out with a song in their hearts, imbued with the Olympic spirit, to participate in the international fellowship, only to die as the helpless victims of an inhuman bloodlust. At one fell swoop the mores of civilization were blotted out. For thousands of years humanity has nurtured the Olympic meet as the epitome of fair play, decent behavior and understanding among all nations.

How foul then to have the Olympics abused by the forces of evil in a malevolent bloodbath of the innocents. We shall never forget the Munich Olympics. We shall not erase from mind the cruel transformation of the world sport arena into a slaughterhouse. The blood of the victims cries from the earth.

We mourn with King David:
"How are the mighty fallen –
they were swifter than
eagles, stronger than lions."

As a tree in a storm, so shall the Jews survive yet this onslaught. But there is no forgiveness. The pain and anguish that is felt by the loss of the eleven Israeli sportsmen will give future athletes the power to press forward ever higher, ever faster.
